

How To Get Counted



Each decade since 1790, Census takers have gone to each home to obtain an accurate count of who is living in the U.S.. In 2020, all those living in the U.S. will have the option of responding by:



mail



phone



online

*Census Takers will go to addresses that have not responded by mail, phone, or online.

The **instructions** on how to **respond online or by phone** will be **delivered by invitation** in the mail starting **March 12, 2020**, please follow the directions provided.

Each invitation will have a **unique number** so that each household will not be counted twice.

Some households will receive a printed questionnaire which they can mail, postage-free, back to the Census Bureau.

- **January 21:** The U.S. Census Bureau starts counting the population in remote Alaska. The count officially begins in the rural Alaskan village of Toksook Bay.
- **March 12 - 20:** Households will begin receiving official Census Bureau mail with detailed information on how to respond to the 2020 Census online, by phone, or by mail.
- **April 1:** Census Day is observed nationwide! By this date, every home will receive an invitation to participate in the 2020 Census. Once the invitation arrives, you should respond for your home in one of three ways: online, by phone, or by mail.
- **May - July:** Census takers will begin visiting homes that haven't responded to the 2020 Census to help make sure everyone is counted.
